About Us:

North Clwyd Animal Rescue was founded in 1978 and became a Registered Charity in 1981. We now care for in excess of 1000 animals each year and this number is ever-growing. The Centre acts as a rehabilitation unit and a temporary home for dogs, cats, rabbits and guinea pigs. We take in all the stray dogs from Flintshire and Denbighshire areas.

Why Are We Needed?

There are an ever-increasing large number of unwanted, abused and abandoned animals in this region and although this is not a unique issue facing this area, we know that there would be a lot more pain and suffering subjected to animals if we ceased to exist. Our heritage tells us that we play a vital part in the community and we also try to educate people of the effects of 'dumping' unwanted pets, as sadly there is an imbalance in the number of good homes and animals waiting to be adopted. We are almost constantly filled to capacity with animal residents and we would ask you for your kind support in helping us to address this problem.

What We Do At NCAR – Be Part Of Our Mission:

During an animal's stay at NCAR, we endeavour to give them as much love and individual attention as possible. At North Clwyd Animal Rescue we now have the facilities to host over 100 dogs, 60 cats and 25 rabbits or guinea pigs. We have a Kitten Unit and 2 Catteries, seven Kennel Blocks, a 'Strays Block' and a 'Rabbit Unit'.

All our resident dogs are walked at least twice a day. All our animal pens are cleaned daily. Upon initial arrival, the animals are checked by our Manager who assesses their condition, and if appropriate, are immediately taken to our Veterinary Centre. If they need medical treatment which can be administered on site then this is carried out. It is our policy that all our animals are fully vaccinated and spayed/neutered either whilst at the Sanctuary or (if their stay is a very short one, and they are homed prior to any of these treatments), the new owners are given a voucher for this to be carried out at our cost. This way the monetary element has been taken away from the new owner and we can effectively help to reduce the unwanted population and many other medical problems. Animal Micro-chipping, which we also undertake, is so important as this registers the animal to the new adopter and if they were ever to stray, we would be able to reunite them.

What We Don't Do?

We do not put any animals to sleep unless they are suffering and will not recover, or they are unsafe to rehome after a behaviourist has worked with the animal at length. Once we take in an animal, it will remain with us until a new home is found.

Where Does Our Money Come From?

North Clwyd Animal Rescue receives no state funding. We rely very heavily on voluntary donations. We do have charity shops which help to bring in much needed regular revenue and with vets bills topping £4,000.00 per month, our existence is becoming increasingly financially difficult. We do charge a minimal 'Donation Fee' for our animals which in most cases does not even cover the Veterinary Bill relating to that animal and we ask owners to complete a Gift Aid Form for this so that we can claim tax back on Animal Donations from the Inland Revenue.

Our Charity shops in Denbigh, Prestatyn, Connah's Quay, Abergele, Colwyn Bay and Mold continue to be invaluable to the running of the Sanctuary and provide a much appreciated boost to funds.
